Cornwall's only city, Truro, is approximately 15 minutes drive away.

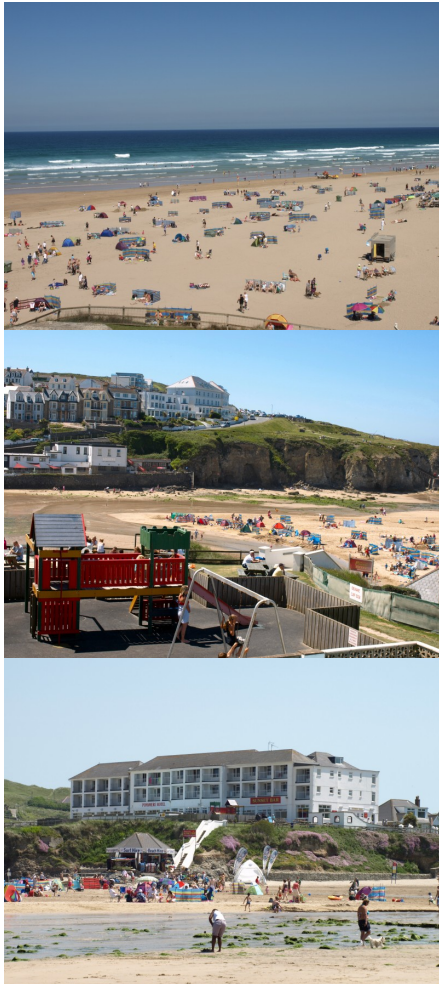
It's famous 3 mile long golden sandy beach has long been known to holidaying families and during surfing season, attracts some of the surfing world's top names to participate in premier division competitions.
